COMING SOON...

Indytel cable is going All-Digital beginning September 6, 2017.

Starting September 6, 2017, Indytel will transition to an All-Digital cable TV signal. We will be switching from an analog to digital signal. At this time we are asking that you check your TVs to see if they are digital capable or if you will need a converter box for this transition.

How to tell if your TVs are Digital-Ready

- I. Look on the front or back of your TV for a sticker that mentions a digital tuner. It may say something like DTV, HDMI, ATSC, Digital Tuner, Digital Receiver, Integrated Digital Tuner or Standard Television Receiving Apparatus.
- 2. Flip through the channels on your TV. Digital channels contain sub-channels in addition to regular channels. For instance, in addition to regular channel 7, a TV with a digital tuner may also display channels 7.1 and 7.2. If you are able to see these sub-channels, your TV is digital ready.



- 3. TVs manufactured in 2004 and after: Your chances of having a built-in digital tuner improve dramatically. Some TVs manufactured from 2004-2006 were advertised as "HD Ready" or "HDTV monitor" sets. That means they can display digital and high definition signals but they need helping getting those signals in the first place. You will still need a special converter or a cable TV connection.
- 4. By law, all TVs manufactured for sale in the US after March 1, 2007 must contain a digital tuner (NTSC tuner). TVs labeled as containing digital or NTSC tuners do not require a converter box.

*Converter boxes will be available for those who find they DO NOT have digital TVs. One box is included at no charge. If you need a converter box, please call the office to let us know.
